

TAR HOLLOW COVID-19 RESPONSE

Please be assured we will work closely with the local public health department to maintain effective protocols for the identification and appropriate treatment of any illnesses that may occur at camp, including COVID-19. We will also continue to keep an eye on the CDC's recommendations as well as local and state agencies.

Below is a list of how we will comply at this time. Please be aware this list will continue to be updated as we move forward.

1. Take the temperature of all staff and campers as they arrive to camp. If any staff member or camper has a fever of 100 degrees or higher, they will be unable to remain at Tar Hollow – they will be required to go home – even if they've had the vaccine.
2. Take the temperature of all staff and campers daily. If any staff member or camper has a fever of 100 degrees or higher, they will be sent home immediately.
3. Staff will continually monitor themselves and campers throughout each day to ensure they are not showing other signs of COVID-19.
4. Staff and campers will be encouraged to wear masks even if they've had the vaccine.
5. Additional hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes and hand soap will be purchased. Hand sanitizer will be located at all tables as well as throughout the main lodge and bath houses on the hills. Hand soap will be at all sinks in the lodge and bath houses on the hills. We will also ask all counselors to have hand sanitizer in their cabin.
6. Everyone will be required to use hand sanitizer and/or wash their hands before and after each meal.
7. Disinfection of all bathrooms in the main lodge will take place a minimum of twice a day. Each hill bath house, beach bath house and the kitchen will be disinfected at least once per day.
8. Disinfection of all tables in the main lodge will take place before and after each meal and any activity.
9. Kitchen staff will wear masks and gloves while preparing food with others present and serving food.
10. All hoppers will be required to wear gloves when serving food and cleaning up after meals.
11. No sharing of drinks or food will be permitted.

Important: if you and/or your family members plan to travel internationally during the last two weeks of June or first two weeks of July or have had exposure to any known carriers of the coronavirus, please consider waiting until next year to attend camp. If you and/or your family are traveling out of the country less than a full 14 days before camp begins, we would like to ask that you consider waiting until next year to attend.

Please note: We reserve the right to limit the number of campers we can accept depending on the number of staff that apply and suggested government guidelines.

These procedures will continue to be modified as the State of Ohio adds or lessens restrictions as we approach July. We will be updating this document accordingly.
